What is the WRP?

The Workforce Recruitment Program (WRP) is a free resource that helps recruiters connect with qualified job candidates with disabilities. Employers can post positions on the [WRP.jobs](http://www.wrp.jobs) website for WRP candidates to access and apply.

Who can I find in the WRP?

Candidates in the WRP database are students and recent graduates with disabilities who are available for internships, part-time or full-time employment. Students are interviewed annually by Federal recruiters and represent a wide range of academic and professional backgrounds.

Who is in the WRP ?

- 2000 students from over 330 accredited institutions
- 148 Veterans
- 165 Engineers
- 43 MBAs
- 126 Accountants
- 196 Health Care Professionals
- 61 Law Students
- 349 Computer Based Majors
- 312 Graduate Students
- 28 Doctoral Candidates

How does the WRP work for me?

- Candidates can apply directly to position postings, which makes it easy to source candidates for employers.
- A new database is created each school year making WRP one of the most up-to-date labor sources for recruiters.

How can I start using the WRP today?
